Yes, our amazing music festival-in-a-day will back again in the village's ICE field on Saturday 31st August, from 2pm to midnight. Tickets are now available for advance purchase from both the Laughing Fish and from our website at www.isfieldhorstedbonfire.com/isfest

A much wider range of food will be provided this year by Isfield Farm Shop, with plenty suitable for vegetarians too. The bar will serve a range of beers and ciders on tap and in can/bottle as well as the very popular cocktails, plus wine and soft drinks. We'll also have activities and entertainment for children provided by Little Horsted School PTFA.

We've kept entrance ticket prices the same as last year, but upgraded things like the toilet provision, which is why this year we're introducing a charge of £5 for camping in tents. Caravans, motorhomes and trailers will still cost £10. Please ensure you pre-book and pay your pitch either online or at the Fish, at the same time as you buy your entry tickets as you must have entry tickets to obtain a pitch pass. Please also note: the field will open for pitching from 10am on Saturday 31 August. No advance pitching will be permitted due to liability and logistical issues.

Isfest is the bonfire society's biggest fundraising event of the year, paying for our free fire-works display every year during Bonfire Season, so please do support us by coming along and joining in the fun.

COMMUNITY FIRST RESPONDERS

An EARLY NOTIFICATION for those of you interested in seeing the latest South East Coast Ambulance Service vehicles and equipment and also learn basic resuscitation skills as well as meeting some of the staff. This is being held very conveniently at the East Sussex National from 1.15pm until 4.30pm on Friday 20th September so please put it in your diary as well as a memo of any points that you would like to raise.

Recruitment was re-opened for Community First Responders towards the end of last year with 328 applications from which 248 candidates were selected to go forward for vetting and training which is still continuing. ~~SECAmb~~ currently has just over 300 CFRs spread across Kent, Surrey and Sussex and North East Hampshire. These First Responders attend roughly 11,000 emergency calls per year of which approximately 3,000 are classified as life-threatening and CFRs do often make a significant contribution to the survival chances of patients. If you are a fit member of the public, over 18 years old and with a clean driving licence that would like to make a difference as a CFR, please get in touch with me so that I can advise when the next recruiting window is opening.

ST MARGARET'S CHURCH

Since I first took up residence in the Parsonage a year ago, things have been quite busy. The most evident increased church activity has been in our new Family Festival Services on the first Sunday of each month (attended by between 17 and 75 people) and the six new Messy Church sessions on Saturdays in the Village Hall. We have over 60 children "on the books" and attendances at Messy are around 25 children plus parents at each session. Our last Messy Church celebrated the fun, fire and wind of Pentecost with a clown, the children making and flying kites in the storm, and having a barbecue!

Behind all this, I've regularly taken assemblies at the Little Horsted school, and Penny and I have run periodic Bible Study ("Coffee Cakes and Christianity") sessions and hosted teatimes to "Meet the Vicar" at the Parsonage. At the church, there have been regular morning prayer services on Saturday and Monday, and 6 baptisms, 3 weddings and 6 funerals. All of St Margaret's activities have been publicised on Facebook and by posters in the village, and notes in this Newsletter.

Sadly, for personal reasons, Penny and I will be standing down at the end of September, and leaving the Parsonage. However, Messy Church and some Family Festival services will continue as shown below, because I will remain as a minister within the Uckfield Holy Cross team, which will enable me to support St Margaret's, albeit at a less intensive level. Morning Prayer, school assemblies and hospitality ministry however, will not be continuing. So, on the first Sunday of each month there will be a Family Service at St Margaret's at 10 am, on the second and fourth the services will revert to traditional (Book of Common Prayer) communions and the third Sunday will be, as now, Matins.

UPDATE FROM YOUR LOCAL MP

Like many of my constituents, I am a passionate campaigner for the environment and I am keen as your MP to make sure our campaigns have a real impact on legislation. It was fantastic news to be the first country to commit to a net-zero economy and it was great to see that we have also agreed to support and expand offshore wind power and have made the historic commitment to close all coal-fired power stations by 2025.

As a Maritime Minister, I led the high

ambition coalition to reach an historic agreement at the International Maritime Organisation (IMO) that will see a reduction of greenhouse gas emissions from shipping by at least 50% in 2050. This year I worked towards launching the world's first clean maritime plan which looks at emissions from ships and ports to ensure protection of our environment and oceans. I have also published and am responsible for our country's first Maritime 2050 Strategy which sets out our ambition for the UK to become a world leader in the move to clean maritime.

It is great to see that campaigning has made a real difference but there is much more work to be done and I look forward to further updates on these issues.
